


Conservation Action Focus

For the third consecutive year, the <u>Conservation Action Focus</u> for World Ocean Day focused on raising awareness and showing support for protecting at least 30% of the planet's lands, waters, and ocean by 2030 ("30x30").

Working in collaboration with the Campaign for Nature, the collective efforts of World Ocean Day event organizers have generated over 70,000 individual petition signatures from 120 countries and an endorsement of support for 30x30 from over 1,100 organizations.



Social media continues to be an upward driver for engagement, marketing, and advancing ocean policies and societal change. Every year there is an increased volume of conservation-themed content during June and especially on and around World Ocean Day.


This year, ocean advocates from around the world generated at least 6.9 million impressions from all World Ocean Day social media channels and #WorldOceanDay was viewed 3.4 billion times on TikTok alone.



In the month leading up to 8 June, World Ocean Day celebrators engaged in a bracket-style competition between the world's most beloved ocean creatures. Ocean advocates who voted for their favorite sea creature online also signed the 30x30 petition and shared it with their personal and professional networks, generating over 5,000 signatures in just eight days!










Reminder: drop the 's'
