World Ocean Day 2024

World Ocean Day provides a unique opportunity for a wide array of organizations and communities to come together on or around 8 June to honor and celebrate our one ocean that connects us all!

Whether you live on the coast or far inland, we all need a healthy ocean and a stable climate to survive and thrive. The ocean generates most of the oxygen we breathe, helps feed us, cleans the water we drink, and regulates our climate. By protecting our ocean, we also protect our climate, and our future.

Together, through thousands of events in 150+ countries, we can increase awareness and action in our communities and also generate the political will -- at both the government and the corporate levels -- to create a healthier blue planet and a better future for all.

In consultation with the <u>World Ocean Day Youth Advisory</u>
<u>Council</u>, this year we launched a new multi-year Action
Theme: <u>Catalyzing Action for Our Ocean & Climate</u>.

Together, we can persuade national policymakers and corporate leaders to follow through on their promises and all the big talk about doing the right thing for our blue planet, with its one ocean and one climate.

The Action Theme provides a way to unite thousands of organizations and millions of individuals on an issue and opportunity of global importance. Throughout the year, we provide tangible opportunities to protect and restore our ocean and help stabilize the climate.

Event Guidance

This June, join together with thousands of other community event organizers in 150+ countries by coordinating activities in celebration of our shared ocean. Ideas for events are limitless and whatever you do, you can make an impact, especially if you <u>integrate the 2024 Action Theme</u>.

To help your celebrations, activities, and other events be

really impactful, we recommend the following tips:
Keep it fun, positive, and solutions-focused with ways for everyone to help.
Include youth (teens and young adults) in a variety of ways, such as having them help plan activities or including youth-oriented education and action activities.
Create a community- or city-wide celebration! Reach out to others in your community, including youth organizations, schools, your local museum, aquarium, or zoo, and local businesses, to collaborate for conservation.
Invite your local media outlets to amplify your event through radio, television, newspaper, and social media coverage.
Take photographs and share them on social media to further amplify your efforts. Tag #WorldOceanDay so we can help share too!
Use the World Ocean Day logo (download for free here!) to connect your community efforts to the global efforts to protect our blue planet.
Submit your event or activities on the <u>Events Calendar and World Map</u> on the WorldOceanDay.org website so we can help promote it with the world.
Tag #WorldOceanDay so others can find your event on social media!

How to List Your Event:

To include your event on the World Ocean Day site, visit the <u>Submit Your Event page</u>. After you complete the form on the website, the submission will be reviewed and approved. You will receive an email confirmation and it will appear on the <u>Events Calendar and World Map</u> on WorldOceanDay.org.





Messaging Guidance for Ocean & Climate Action

Include an ask for attendees

Including an action-related "ask" to help the ocean and climate improves the experience for people involved with your activities and events.

Emphasize the solutions and stay focused on the positive

People respond well to a positive message that specifically invites them to be part of the solution. There are <u>lots of known solutions</u> to these issues and we can all help convey that.

Engage younger audiences

Research shows that people in their teens and twenties are more interested, engaged and primed to take action. We can support young people to be not only the leaders of tomorrow, but also today!

Highlight specific animals and particular places

People easily connect with the idea of helping a specific type of animal or place. You can help people involved in your event connect that feeling to why taking ocean and climate action is important for safeguarding that special place and the animals.

Remember to emphasize in your communications that <u>ocean action</u> IS climate action!

Emphasize popular support

Sharing the fact that 8 out of 10 people on our planet feel that it's <u>"essential that our government does whatever it takes to limit the effects of climate change"</u> will help demonstrate that taking action is a popular cause and inspire even more involvement!

DON'T:

Expect people to know that ocean conservation and climate change are connected

Whenever possible, emphasize and explain the interconnectedness between a healthy ocean and a healthy climate.

Overwhelm people with information on the process

Most people are unlikely to be concerned about the specifics of the ocean and climate processes. Keep it simple! The solutions exist. We just need to increase more awareness about how each person can help!



These tips are based on more than 25 years of research and shared experiences and includes a specific emphasis on communication about ocean and climate issues. Utilize these guidelines in your outreach on your website, social media, and during events!
